## Punjab Engineering College (PEC) U.T Chandigarh

The Right to information (RTI) Act, 2005 is a game changer act which has made significant improvements in the ways of departmental working and service delivery. In view of tremendous scope of public welfare via RTI tools, the Government of India is introducing new norms to ensure compliance of RTI mandate across the departments. Third party audit is one among such practices for pro-active RTI disclosures in the departments.

The Department of Personnel and Training, U.T. Administration Chandigarh had requested the Institute vide Chandigarh Administration Letter No. 03/19-IH(12)/Pers.& Trg. - 2025/4005 dated 25/03/2025 to conduct a 'Proactive Disclosure Package' audited by third Party under Section 4 of the Right to Information Act, 2005. The Institute carried out the project as per directions of the Government.

Section 4 (1)(b) of the RTI Act lays down the information which should be disclosed by Public Authorities on a *suo motu* or proactive basis. Based on Section 4(1)(b) of Right to Information Act, 2005, any Public authority is supposed to share a specific information on the public domain within 120 days of the enactment of the Act. Section 4(2) and Section 4(3) prescribe the method of dissemination of this information. The purpose of *suo motu* disclosure under section 4 is to place large amount of information in public domain on a proactive basis to make the functioning of the Public Authorities more transparent and also to reduce the need for filing individual RTI applications.

Since the promulgation of the Act in 2005, large amount of information relating to functioning of the government is being put in public domain. However, the quality and quantity of proactive disclosure should be more given priority with frequent updation by the respective departments. Further there is need to set up a compliance mechanism to ensure that requirements under section 4 of the RTI Act are met.

In Punjab Engineering College (PEC), UT, CHD, audit of section 4(1)b of RTI Act, 2005 was done by getting information through self-structured Transparency Audit Form (TAF).

The main objective of Punjab Engineering College (PEC), UT, Chandigarh is as follows:

 To become centre of excellence in technical education and research and to occupy a place amongst the most eminent institutions of the nation.

The details of the Transparency Audit Form and the scoring pattern are as under:

The Transparency Audit Form comprises of six parts with a maximum score of 100 marks. The weightage among these six components is allotted as per the nature and significance of the questions. The components of the Transparency Audit Form are mentioned below:



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

In organizational characteristics and functions of various officers/ officials in hierarchy, the department scored 9.7 out of 10 marks which indicated that the department provided information pertaining to their organization and its functions which was **fully met**. In Budget and Programme, the department scored 9.88 out of 10 marks which indicated that the department uploaded information with regards to budget and programme which was **fully met**. In the third part i.e. Publicity band Public interface, the department scored 25 out of 25 marks which indicated that the department provided relevant information relating to publicity band and public interface and the result remained **fully met**.

In the next part that dealt with <u>E-Governance</u>, the department got 19.59 out of 20 marks which indicated that the result was <u>fully met</u>. In part V i.e. <u>Information as may be prescribed</u>, the department again scored 10 out of 10 marks. The reason for such good marks is attributed to the fact that the information provided by the department in this part was <u>fully met</u>. In the last part, which dealt with <u>Suo motu</u> disclosure of <u>Information under section 4 of RTI Act</u>, 2005/Information disclosed on own initiative, the department had given relevant information for the convenience of the litigants on their official website and thus scored 25 out of 25 marks in this part. Hence, in this part the department scored full marks and the requirements of the institute in this part were <u>fully met</u>.

The department obtained an aggregate of 98.2 out of 100 marks, which indicated that the department had furnished relevant information pertaining to every domain mentioned in the TAF. It was also found that the department used user friendly language and had also uploaded Transparency Audit form along with annexures timely on their website link, <a href="https://pec.ac.in/rti.">https://pec.ac.in/rti.</a>

In view of above discussion, it can be assessed that Punjab Engineering College (PEC), UT, Chandigarh, has completed third party audit process conducted by MGSIPA, Chandigarh as part of 'Proactive Disclosure Package' Audited by Third Party under Section 4 of the Right to Information Act, 2005 across all the departments of Union Territory, Chandigarh for the financial year 2024-25.

## SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

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The Right to Information Act is an act with practical usage. It helps citizens to stay informed and also ensures transparent working in Government administrative structures. The obligation to share information with the citizens adds additional responsibility on the public officers to manage, maintain and monitor records efficiently and effectively. There is immense need of awareness among all frontiers of Governance so as to ensure the effective implementation of Right to Information Act. There are some general suggestions that can be referred by the departments to create mass awareness among citizens and Government authorities regarding RTI Act:

- The digital and social media platforms can serve as effective agents to generate mass awareness among people.
   Print media like mass.
- Print media like magazines, pamphlets, hoardings, boards and newspapers can also be used to share RTI related information among the public.
   Government authorities
- Government authorities can organize educational programmes such as street plays, *Nukkad Nataks* etc. to further advance the understanding of the act.
- Government authorities should bring out comprehensive guidelines and information in the form of booklets and handbooks related to RTI Act 2005.

The acts like RTI Act need widespread publicity so as to increase its outreach and to ensure that information is available on public domains for transparent Government working.
