Therefore, Senate conceptually approves the proposal. However, a detailed proposal may be prepared for Centre of Energy Studies as well as the associated academic program to be run by the Centre by taking feedback from various synergy departments & other stakeholders. The detail proposal may be put to the Senate based on the recommendations of DAPC/ IAPC.

For the next semester, attempts may be made to map courses available on EDX/ Coursera in addition to

		<p>courses available on the Swayam portal. The MOOCs implementation Committee may complete this process well in advance before the subject registration date of 17182 semester as given in the academic calendar.</p>
T-72.6	<p>Regarding teaching of UG/ PG courses</p>	<p>The Senate members deliberated on the issue and decided the following:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Each faculty member in each department/ Centre will be given lecture group of at least one PG and one UG course in an academic year. For example, faculty members offering three courses in one academic year may offer two UG and one PG course/ one UG and two PG courses in odd & even semesters. 2. Further, all first year courses should be given to experienced faculty members. This would ensure proper handling of these classes and dissemination of knowledge gained through their experience to the new students. 3. The tutorial and practical classes should be engaged by the faculty members. M. Tech and Ph.D. students should be involved as teaching assistants only.

ANNEXURE 'D' (Item No. T-72.3)

Subject: Contingency grant to Ph.D. scholar and M. Tech. students

The existing contingency grant and approved grants as per UGC guidelines for Ph.D. scholar is as under:-

Existing	Approved
Contingency grant of Rs. 10,000/- is given to Ph.D scholars. However, this is being given by respective departments as per requirement.	The contingency grant to Ph.D scholars as per UGC norms is as under:- <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Rs. 12,000/- p.a. for initial two years• Rs. 25,000/- p.a. for remaining tenure

For M. Tech. students the contingency grant is as under:-

Contingency grant is Rs. 5,000/- per student per year for GATE qualified students.	As per UGC guidelines (2012-17), the contingency grant to PG students of ME/M.Tech/ M.Pharma for GATE/ GPAT qualified candidates is Rs. 5,000/- per annum.

The contingency grant will be given as per UGC guidelines. The contingency grant shall cover expenses of following:-

1. Books, Journals, cost of photocopying of documents
2. Payments of fellowships/ memberships of professional organisations/ societies.
3. Travels to conferences, workshop and other education trips.
4. Purchase of computers software peripherals, accessories and software.
5. Internet bill for students located outside the campus.
6. Purchase of samples/ kits or any other material required for experimental work, conduct of survey, field visit etc.
